2. DIVIDEND:

With a view to conserving the resources of the Company, the Board does not recommend payment of dividend for the year ended 31st March, 2017.

3. FIXED DEPOSITS:

During the year under review, the Company has not accepted any deposits within the meaning of Section 73 of the Companies Act, 2013 and the Companies (Acceptance of Deposits) Rules, 2014 and as such, no amount of principal or interest was outstanding as of the date of the Balance Sheet.

4. TRANSFER TO RESERVES:

During the financial year 2016-17, ₹ 4.54 lakhs have been transferred to General Reserve as compared to ₹ 4.91 lakhs in the previous year.

5. STATE OF COMPANY'S AFFAIRS:

During the year, the Company's income was ₹ 46.23 lakhs (2015-16: ₹ 49.88 lakhs) against expenses of ₹ 0.86 lakh (2015-16: ₹ 0.75 lakh). The profit after tax was ₹ 46.14 lakhs (2015-16: ₹ 47.81 lakhs). The accrued balance of

₹ 233.47 lakhs available for appropriation as on 31st March, 2017 was carried forward to the Balance Sheet.

The Company has received Dividend Income of ₹ 46.04 lakhs during the year (2015-16: ₹ 45.63 lakhs).

6. MATERIAL CHANGES:

There have been no material changes and commitments affecting the financial position of the Company which have occurred between the end of the financial year of the Company to which the financial statements relate and the date of this report.

7. DETAILS OF SUBSIDIARIES, JOINT VENTURES AND ASSOCIATE COMPANIES:

The Company is a wholly owned subsidiary of National Peroxide Limited. During the year under review, the Company did not have any subsidiary, joint ventures or associate companies.

There were 6 (Six) meetings of the Board of Directors held on 25th April, 2016; 16th May, 2016; 1st August, 2016; 20th September, 2016; 11th November, 2016 and 14th February, 2017 during the financial year 2016-17.

The paid-up Equity Share Capital of the Company was ₹ 25.50 lakhs as on 31st March, 2017. During the year under review, there was no change in the Share Capital of the Company.

INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

TO THE MEMBERS OF NAPEROL INVESTMENTS LIMITED

Report on the Financial Statements

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of **NAPEROL INVESTMENTS LIMITED** ('the Company'), which comprise the Balance Sheet as at 31 March 2017, the Statement of Profit and Loss and the Cash Flow Statement for the year then ended, and a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information.

Management's Responsibility for the Financial Statements

The Company's Board of Directors is responsible for the matters stated in Section 134(5) of the Companies Act, 2013 ("the Act") with respect to the preparation and presentation of these financial statements that give a true and fair view of the financial position, financial performance and cash flows of the Company in accordance with the accounting principles generally accepted in India, including the Accounting Standards specified under Section 133 of the Act, read with Rule 7 of the Companies (Accounts) Rules, 2014. This responsibility also includes maintenance of adequate accounting records in accordance with the provisions of the Act for safeguarding the assets of the Company and for preventing and detecting frauds and other irregularities; selection and application of appropriate accounting policies; making judgments and estimates that are reasonable and prudent; and design, implementation and maintenance of adequate internal financial controls, that were operating effectively for ensuring the accuracy and completeness of the accounting records, relevant to the preparation and presentation of the financial statements that give a true and fair view and are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

Auditor's Responsibility

Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit.

We have taken into account the provisions of the Act, the accounting and auditing standards and matters which are required to be included in the audit report under the provisions of the Act and the Rules made thereunder.

We conducted our audit in accordance with the Standards on Auditing specified under Section 143(10) of the Act. Those Standards require that we comply with ethical requirements and plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatement.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and the disclosures in the financial statements. The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgment, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatement of

the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal financial control relevant to the Company's preparation of the financial statements that give a true and fair view in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances. An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of the accounting policies used and the reasonableness of the accounting estimates made by the Company's Directors, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the financial statements.

We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our audit opinion on the financial statements.

Opinion

In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the aforesaid financial statements give the information required by the Act in the manner so required and give a true and fair view in conformity with the accounting principles generally accepted in India, of the state of affairs of the Company as at 31 March 2017 and its profit and its cash flows for the year ended on that date.

Report on other Legal and Regulatory Requirements

1. As required by the Companies (Auditor's Report) Order, 2016 ("the Order") issued by the Central Government of India in terms of sub-section (11) of section 143 of the Act, we give in the **Annexure A**, a statement on the matters specified in the paragraph 3 and 4 of the order.
2. As required by Section 143 (3) of the Act, we report that:
 - (a) we have sought and obtained all the information and explanations which to the best of our knowledge and belief were necessary for the purposes of our audit;
 - (b) in our opinion proper books of account as required by law have been kept by the Company so far as it appears from our examination of those books;
 - (c) the balance sheet, the statement of profit and loss and the cash flow statement dealt with by this Report are in agreement with the books of account;
 - (d) in our opinion, the aforesaid financial statements comply with the Accounting Standards specified under Section 133 of the Act, read with Rule 7 of the Companies (Accounts) Rules, 2014;
 - (e) on the basis of the written representations received from the directors as on March 2016 taken on record by the Board of Directors, none of the directors is disqualified as on 31 March 2017 from being appointed as a director in terms of Section 164 (2) of the Act;
 - (f) with respect to the adequacy of the internal financial controls over financial reporting of the Company and the operating effectiveness of such controls, refer to our separate report in "**Annexure B**"; and

(g) with respect to the other matters to be included in the Auditor's Report in accordance with Rule 11 of the Companies (Audit and Auditors) Rules, 2014, in our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us:

- i. the Company does not have any pending litigations which could impact its financial position in its financial statements;
- ii. the Company has does not have any long-term contracts including derivative contracts for which there could be any material foreseeable losses hence no provision is required in the financial statements;
- iii. There were no amounts required to be transferred to the Investor Education and Protection Fund by the Company.
- iv. The Company has provided requisite disclosures in the standalone financial statements as regards its holding and dealings in Specified Bank Notes as defined in the Notification S.O. 3407(E) dated the 8th November 2016 of the Ministry of Finance, during the period from 8th November 2016 to 30th December 2016. NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Company Overview

NAPEROL Investments Limited (the Company), a wholly owned subsidiary of National Peroxide Limited. The Company, incorporated on May 06, 1980 is a registered Non Banking Financial Company as provided by Section 45 - IA of the Reserve Bank of India Act, 1934. The Company is engaged in the business of long term investment and corporate lending.

1. Significant Accounting Policies:

(a) Basis of accounting and preparation of financial statements:

The financial statements of the Company have been prepared in accordance with the Generally Accepted Accounting Principles in India (Indian GAAP) to comply with the Accounting Standards prescribed under Section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013, and the relevant provisions of the Companies Act, 2013 ("the 2013 Act") as applicable. The financial statements have been prepared on accrual basis under the historical cost convention. The accounting policies adopted in the preparation of the financial statements are consistent with those followed in the previous year.

(b) Use of Estimates:

The presentation of the financial statements in conformity with the generally accepted accounting principles requires the Management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amount of assets and liabilities, revenues and expenses and disclosure of contingent liabilities. Such estimates and assumptions are based on management's evaluation of relevant facts and circumstances as on the date of financial statements. The actual outcome may diverge from these estimates.

(c) Investments:

Long-term Investments are stated at cost. Provision for diminution in the value of long-term investments is made only if such decline is other than temporary. Current investments are carried at lower of cost and quoted/fair value, computed category wise.

(d) Revenue Recognition:

Dividends are accounted as and when the right to receive payment is established. Interest is accounted on accrual basis. Income from interest is recognised on a time basis determined by the amount outstanding and the rate applicable.

(e) Taxes on Income:

Current tax is determined as the amount of tax payable in respect of taxable income for the period.

Deferred tax is recognised, subject to the consideration of prudence, on timing differences, being the difference between taxable income and accounting income that originate in one period are capable of reversal in one or more subsequent periods. Deferred tax assets are not recognised on unabsorbed depreciation and carry forward of losses unless there is virtual certainty that sufficient future taxable income will be available against which such deferred tax assets can be realised.

Minimum Alternative Tax (MAT) credit is recognised as an asset on the basis of the considerations that there being a convincing evidence of realisation of the asset and in the year in which the MAT credit becomes eligible to be recognised, the said asset is created by way of credit to the profit and loss account.

(f) Current/Non-Current:

All assets and liabilities are presented as Current or Non-Current as per the Company's normal operating cycle and other criteria set out in Schedule III of the Companies Act, 2013. Based on the nature of products and the time between acquisition of assets, the Company has ascertained its operating cycle as 12 months for the purpose of Current/Non-current classification of assets and liabilities.
